Content -

Where in Scripture do you turn when you need guidance on how to pray?

David

1. Read Psalm 3:1-8. Here David is facing a grave situation in his life, and knowing this we see how he chooses to pray to God. What stands out to you about this interaction between him and the Father?

2. How does Psalm 18:6 share a different perspective on David's prayer life with the Father?

How can you apply this to your own time of prayer?

3. Read 1Chronicles 29:10-13 and then read Matthew 6:9-13. How does David's prayer compare to the Lord's Prayer?

Paul

4. In Ephesians 1:15-16 Paul teaches us that we should give thanks for the brothers and sisters in our lives that God has given us to do community and life with. Who in your life has God given you to share life with that you can remember to keep in your prayers today?

5. Similarly, as we pray for those in our lives who know Christ, we need to pray for each other to be built up in Him. What examples can you find from Paul in Colossians 1:9-20 that describe how to pray like this?

6. Matthew 14:30 is one example when Peter cries out to Jesus, asking to be saved as he believes he is about to drown. When have you prayed to Jesus in a similar manner when you couldn't see a solution or felt you were in a hopeless situation?

Commitment

7. When you pray this week, try to remember and implement P.A.C.T.:

Praise	“with awestruck wonder”
Ask	“with bold faith”
Confess	“with humble submission”
Thank	“with heartfelt gratitude”
