### Content

#### **"Authority Motivates Action"**

First thoughts, what does this statement mean to you?

1. Which areas in your life do you have authority in?
2. Do you see it as a derived authority (temporarily granted ) or intrinsic (inherited)?
3. Reading **Romans 13:1**- What stands out to you?

### **Jesus is Authority**

4. "Authority" (in Greek 'exousia') refers to the rightful and legitimate exercise of power. All authority can be characterized as either derived or intrinsic. God is the Creator of the universe, only the triune God has purely intrinsic authority and all other authority is derived from God.

With this in mind, what are your thoughts on your authority from God? How have you been a good or poor steward of it?

5. Reading **Colossians 1:15-20**, how would you describe God & Jesus' authority? How does their authority apply to you?

## How do people respond when Jesus uses His authority?

5. Read Mathew 8:5-13 ( The Faith of the Centurion) & Mark 6:1-6 ( A Prophet Without Honor). What do these passages say to you?

6. How do you respond to Jesus' authority?

7. Jesus used His authority to restore our relationship with God. How does Jesus' authority influence our relationship with God?

## How does the authority of Jesus influence how you relate to God?

8. Reading Hebrews 4:14-16, how does Jesus's authority influence our relationship with God? How are we called to live our lives differently because of His authority?
